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Welcome

Our school has been at the heart of the community since 1814. Its rich history, combined with our innovative approach to teaching and learning within a strong Christian ethos, makes our school a unique and vibrant place of learning.

Working at Eltham Church of England Primary School means that you are part of a rich history, a dynamic present and an exciting future. This is because of the deliberate and forward thinking teams that operate across the school.

The Senior Leadership Team is determined that the children will receive an exciting, contextual and vibrant curriculum. This is established by genuine distributed leadership, not just distributed tasks.

Senior and Middle Leaders are encouraged and supported through appraisal, development opportunities and CPD, including accredited NPQ courses. They in turn lead, develop and

Teachers who were NQTs in 2012 are now Assistant Headteachers, homegrown Phase Leaders and Subject Leaders who are clear about what it means to be a school leader at Eltham.

The school has successfully completed a multi million pound rebuild, including a sensitive modernisation of our 150 year old Victorian building, creating a vibrant entrance, shared space, Early Years Department and outside play areas, each designed with children and inspiring learning environments as the primary focus. The newly built teaching block includes 12 bright contemporary classrooms as well as a large multi-purporse hall and studio.

Welcome from Our Chair of Governors Rupert Osborn

I have been a parent governor and co-opted governor for over 12 years and Chair of Eltham's governing body for the last 7.5. During my time we have maintained our outstanding status for over 10 years, rebuilt the school into an exceptional teaching environment having been utilising a building that was 150 years old. The success of this project was recognised by our local heritage society with an award for protecting the heritage of the original school and by the National Governance Association where we were joint second in their awards in 2019 for outstanding governance in a single school.

In addition we, at the request of Royal Borough of Greenwich and the Southwark Diocesan Board of Education, supplied support and leadership to another school in Greenwich for 3 years whilst their finances were put back into a positive position allowing them to appoint a new headteacher.

Our Ethos

The ethos of Eltham Church of England Primary School, including our times of Collective Worship.

Eltham Church of England School seeks to serve its community in the name of the Church by ensuring excellent education in a Christian setting.

Our 21st century school is a stimulating learning environment that prepares students for living and being an active member of their community. We encourage them to value the rich diversity of cultures they will encounter, and pupils are empowered to achieve their highest possible in academic, creative and sporting achievement, both as members of a community and as individuals. The school provides pupils and staff with many opportunities to explore the significance of Christian faith and values to their own lives and the issues facing people locally, nationally and globally. The school is committed to ensuring that the learning, social, and personal needs of all its students are met by its curriculum

and extra-curricular activities.

The spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of the students is set in the context of Christian faith as taught and lived in the Church of England.

The school's distinctive ethos and approach are offered to all members of the school community. Christian students find their faith affirmed and valued, and they meet and work with people who hold to other faiths and philosophies, including those of 'no faith'. All students encounter, in the lives of Christians in the school and in the school's ethos, a living Christian witness which welcomes and affirms. All members of the school's community are equally valued and are encouraged to contribute their understandings and abilities to the school's work and ethos. The beliefs of those from other religious traditions are treated with respect and openness.

Our Values

At Eltham Church of England Primary School, we strive to provide learning experiences that inspire a love of learning. We aim to make learning truly irresistible through developing an engaging, creative, active and investigative curriculum that meets all of the aspects of the National Curriculum and is made relevant with tasks and activities being planned through a central 'core text'.

Our Approach

It is ours, and every school's responsibility "to promote the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs". At Eltham Church of England Primary School we promote these values in the following ways:



Mutual Respect

The respect demonstrated by the staff, children, parents and school community at Eltham Church of England Primary School is a feature of the school's ethos and values.

The school and children are continually receiving positive and complimentary comments from parents, visitors and the general public when out on trips.

The ethos of our school nurtures this understanding of mutual respect and it underpins the engaging and exciting teaching and learning that happens here.

School life at Eltham Church of England Primary School abides by our values of: Friendship, Honesty, Love, Resilience, Forgiveness, Understanding, Wisdom, Enthusiasm, Respect, Sharing and Humility.

The children and all staff connected to our school understand these and work in a manner that encourages everyone to achieve to their highest ability.



Individual Liberty

Our School is a safe place for children with a culture in which children can make choices about their school life in a supportive environment.

We educate our pupils to know that they have boundaries within which they may make choices safely, through the provision of a nurturing mindset and empowering education. Pupils are encouraged to know, understand, and exercise their rights and personal freedoms and are advised on how to exercise these safely, for example through our E-Safety and PSHE lessons.

Eltham provides an extensive range of extra curricular activites and pupils are given the freedom to make choices. From the start of their school journey, children are encouraged to challenge their personal best by making them owners of their own learning. Children regularly have next steps shared with them, both verbally or by written feedback in books so they know exactly how to progress.



The Rule of Law

Behaviour and safety at Eltham Church of England Primary School is outstanding and is seen as a key feature of life at the school and the entire school community.

Children know what is expected of them, why rules are so important, and what the consequences are if they do not follow them. Children at Eltham Church of England Primary School are well aware of what an exciting curriculum they learn in and that their sustained excellent behaviour enables them to become learners of the highest calibre.

Collective Worship

We recognise that God is at the heart of the school, and so collective worship has a high priority in the school's daily life. Collective worship is wholly Christian and parents may withdraw their children on religious grounds. Our times of Collective Worship are of high quality and planned to engage all members of the school's community. The school

is a place in which children and staff are cared for and where they learn to care for one another.

Eltham Church of England School seeks to achieve its aims and develop its life and ethos through answering God's call to "Act Justly, Love Mercy and Walk Humbly with your God".



Tolerance of those with Different Faiths and Beliefs

This is achieved through enhancing pupils' understanding of their place in a culturally diverse society and by giving them opportunities to experience such diversity. We are lucky to be situated in a London Borough that is rich in both cultures and languages.

Rev. Caroline regularly holds times of Collective Worship in the school and furthermore, we learn about the other faiths and beliefs held at Eltham Church of England Primary School through whole-school assemblies where we celebrate and learn about the religious festivals that happen throughout the school year. We harness these cultural links in our classes and because Religious Education is taught as a core subject at Eltham Church of England Primary School, alongside Christianity each year group learns about another major religion each year.

Therefore the carefully planned creative curriculum, alongside the fully embedded ethos of "What does the Lord require of you" to "Act Justly, Love Mercy, Walk Humbly with your God", which ensures that children who attend Eltham Church of England Primary School are fully prepared for life in modern Britain.



Working in Partnership

Working in partnership with other church schools in Greenwich, Eltham Church of England Primary School is part of an innovative network of schools that work closely together. This is called the 'Alliance of Greenwich Anglican Schools'.

Visior

To build on the relationships and shared Christian values that Greenwich church schools have established so that its structure supports school improvement and pupil outcomes as a result of structured School Improvement through School to School Support (SISS).

Structure

Alliance of Greenwich Anglican Schools (AGAS) has a 'flat' structure, where each school maintains its unique identity, leadership and governance, having an equal voice in discussions and decisions, made up of the Headteachers from each school. The schools are proudly Christian within the Diocese of Southwark and are committed in using school to school support to develop teachers' practice, leadership capacity and pupil achievements for their local community.

How Well Do Our Children Achieve?


Teaching and Learning at Eltham Church of England Primary School has been judged as Outstanding since 2008. Since our Ofsted Inspection we have undergone a rigorous programme of self evaluation and review each year to ensure that we maintain our Outstanding expectation and practice.

Therefore, children consistently achieve highly at every point in their journey with us. Our results are regularly above National and Royal Borough of Greenwich averages at Early Years, Key Stage 1, Phonics check-up and End of Key Stage 2 tests.


Pupils meeting expected standard in reading, writing and maths




Pupils achieving at a higher standard in reading, writing and maths


